Caring for the Health of Residents

Sun, 23 Sept - The office of YB Nurul Izzah has successfully conducted another free clinic program, this time at Block C of PPR Kerinchi in Pantai Dalam. This program, which ran from 10am to 1pm, saw some 71 residents receive free medical check-ups as well as basic medication from a qualified doctor - something which is not available at the 1Malaysia clinics, contrary to the Medical Professions Act.

These monthly free clinics are very popular with residents, as on average between 50-100 people participate. Unfortunately, the office is limited by the number of volunteer doctors as well as location - on a number of occasions the program has had to be shifted at the very last minute, due to halls suddenly being blocked by certain irresponsible parties.

Nonetheless, the work of providing free medical service continues, with the next being a blood donation drive on 7th October at Perumahan Pantai

Friday, 21 Sept - YB Nurul Izzah continues her visits to areas in her constituency prior to the start of Parliament on 24th September. The main aim is to hear the feedback from residents and constituents on issues most affecting them. For residents in Taman Seri Sentosa, which was the area visited today, some of the main problems faced include the rising cost of goods, rampant crime, and the worsening traffic jams especially during peak hours.

Residents are concerned that some roads are full of holes, although they are quick to remember that DBKL must be taken to task as it is the entity in charge of such matters.

One other area that is of concern is the increased presence of illegal gambling dens that sometimes masquerade as cybercafes.

YB Nurul Izzah has taken note of these issues, and will raise them both with the relevant authorities for further action as well as to be raised in Parliament.

Subang radar system down for 2 hours



Friday, 21 Sept - Malaysians were shocked to learn that the recently upgraded radar and radio system at the Subang Air Traffic Control Centre (ATCC) completely failed for two hours on 12th September 2012 between 02.50am and 04.15am. This loss was attributed to power failure, something which many find rather hard to believe.

YB Nurul Izzah, YB Tian Chua, N Surendran and General Dato' Hadi were at the Subang ATCC to brief members of the media about this latest scandal involving Advanced Air Traffic (AAT) (M) Sdn Bhd, which coincidentally is where DS Jamaluddin Jarjis's son is a director.

While the Department of Civil Aviation is quick to deny that the system had comprehensively failed, word is going round that the system has allegedly failed **again**. More soon.
